1. INTRODUCTION

This report has been prepared by Ernst & Young, an approved company auditor, for inclusion in the Circular to Shareholders of Avenue Capital Resources Berhad to be dated 3 May 2006, in connection with proposed merger between Avenue Capital Resources Berhad ("ACRB") and ECM Libra Berhad ("ECM Libra"), via the proposed acquisitions by Avenue International Capital Berhad ("AICB") of the operating subsidiaries of ECM Libra.

2. GENERAL INFORMATION

This report has been prepared in relation to the subsidiaries of ECM Libra Berhad which are to be acquired by AICB, which comprise the following:

- (i) ECM Libra Securities Sdn Bhd ("ECMLS") and its four wholly-owned subsidiaries comprising:
 - ECM Libra Securities Nominees Sdn Bhd ("ECMLSN")
 - ECM Libra Securities Nominees (Tempatan) Sdn Bhd ("ECMLSN(T)")
 - ECM Libra Securities Nominees (Asing) Sdn Bhd ("ECMLSN(A)")
 - ECM Libra Securities Portfolio Management Sdn Bhd ("ECMLSPM")
- (ii) ECM Libra Holdings Limited ("ECMLH") and its three wholly-owned subsidiaries comprising:
 - ECM Libra Investment Bank Limited ("ECMLIB")
 - ECM Libra Investments Limited ("ECML Investments")
 - ECM Libra Securities Limited ("ECML SecLtd")

- (iv) ECM Libra Capital Sdn Bhd ("ECMLC")

2.1 ECMLS

ECMLS was incorporated on 19 September 1987 in Malaysia as a private limited company under the Companies Act, 1965 as BBMB Securities Sdn Bhd and assumed its present name on 20 May 2004. Its authorised and issued and fully paid-up share capital as at 31 March 2005 was RM130,000,000 and RM101,038,732 comprising 130,000,000 and 101,038,732 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each respectively. The principal activity of ECMLS is that of a stockbroking company.

Prior to 18 August 2000, the holding company and the ultimate holding company of ECMLS were BBMB Securities (Holdings) Sdn. Bhd. and Bank Bumiputra Malaysia Berhad, both of which were incorporated in Malaysia. Pursuant to the merger of Bank Bumiputra Malaysia Berhad and Bank of Commerce Berhad, ECMLS was acquired by Khazanah Nasional Berhad, the Malaysian Government investment arm. Subsequent to another corporate exercise in 2004, and effective from 30 March 2004, ECMLS became a wholly owned subsidiary of ECM Libra.

ECMLS has four wholly owned subsidiaries namely:

- ECML\$N(T)
- ECMLSN(A)
- ECMLSPM

2.2 ECMLSN

ECMLSN was incorporated in Malaysia as a private limited company under the Companies Act, 1965 on 3 February 1988 under the name of BBMB Securities Nominees Sdn. Bhd. ECMLSN adopted its present name on 20 May 2004 and is currently dormant. Its authorised and issued and fully paid-up share capital as at 31 March 2005 was RM50,000 and RM2 comprising 50,000 and 2 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each respectively.

2.3 ECMLSN(T)

ECMLSN(T) was incorporated in Malaysia as a private limited company under the Companies Act, 1965 on 11 June 1993 under the name of BBMB Securities Nominees (Tempatan) Sdn. Bhd. ECMLSN(T) adopted its present name on 20 May 2004 and is principally engaged in the provision of nominee services for clients in Malaysia. Its authorised and issued and fully paid-up share capital as at 31 March 2005 was RM50,000 and RM10,000 comprising 50,000 and 10,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each respectively.



2.4 ECMLSN(A)

ECMLSN(A) was incorporated in Malaysia as a private limited company under the Companies Act, 1965 on 9 June 1993 under the name of BBMB Securities Nominees (Asing) Sdn. Bhd. ECMLSN(A) adopted its present name on 20 May 2004 and is principally engaged in the provision of nominee services for clients outside Malaysia. Its authorised and issued and fully paid-up share capital as at 31 March 2005 was RM50,000 and RM10,000 comprising 50,000 and 10,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each respectively.

2.5 ECMLSPM

ECMLSPM was incorporated in Malaysia as a private limited company under the Companies Act, 1965 on 8 August 1990 under the name of BBMB Securities Portfolio Management Sdn Bhd. ECMLSPM adopted its present name on 20 May 2004 and has not commenced operations since its incorporation. Its authorised and issued and fully paid-up share capital as at 31 March 2005 was RM50,000 and RM2 comprising 50,000 and 2 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each respectively.

2.6 ECMLH

ECMLH was incorporated in the Federal Territory of Labuan on 19 June 2002 under the Offshore Companies Act, 1990 under the name of ECM Holdings Limited. It changed its name to the present name on 31 March 2004. Its authorised share capital as at 31 March 2005 was USD6,000,000 comprising 6,000,000 ordinary shares of USD1.00 each, of which 1,316,000 ordinary shares of USD1.00 each are issued and fully paid-up. The principal activities of ECMLH are that of investment holding and provision of advisory services.

ECMLH has three wholly owned subsidiaries namely:

- ECMLIB
- ECML Investments
- ECML SecLtd

2.7 ECMLIB

ECMLIB was incorporated in the Federal Territory of Labuan on 29 August 2002 under the Offshore Companies Act, 1990 and licensed as an offshore investment bank by the Labuan Offshore Financial Services Authority ("LOFSA"). Its principal activities include provision of offshore investment banking and related financial services under the Offshore Banking Act, 1990. As at 31 March 2005, the authorised share capital of ECMLIB was USD15,000,000 comprising 15,000,000 ordinary shares of USD1.00 each, of which 10,000,000 ordinary shares of USD1.00 each are issued and fully paid-up.

2.8 ECML Investments

ECML Investments was incorporated in the British Virgin Islands on 2 July 2004 as Bigfield Investments Limited, and adopted its present name on 26 August 2004. It is principally an investment holding company and holds a 29.2% equity interest in the Westcomb Financial Group Limited, a company listed on Singapore's SGX-ST Dealing and Automated Quotation System. Westcomb Financial Group's principal activities are the provision of corporate advisory, securities dealing and fund management services



As at 31 March 2005, the authorised share capital of ECML Investments was USD50,000 comprising 50, 000 ordinary shares of USD1.00 each, of which 1 ordinary share of USD1.00 each is issued and fully paid-up.

2.9 ECML SecLtd

ECML SecLtd is a member firm of the Stock Exchange of Hong Kong and is principally involved in securities dealing. It was incorporated in Hong Kong under the Companies Ordinance (Chapter 32) on 1 March 2002 as Wolverton Holdings Limited and was renamed as Libra Asia Limited on 3 May 2002. The entity later assumed its present name on 21 March 2003. Its authorised share capital as at 31 March 2005 was HKD10,000,000 divided into 10,000,000 ordinary shares of HKD1.00 each, of which all are issued and fully paid-up.

2.10 ECMLP

ECMLP was incorporated as Synergy Transform Sdn Bhd, a private limited company on 21 April 1999 under the Companies Act, 1965. It changed its name to Libra Partners Sdn Bhd on 1 June 1999 and assumed its present name on 9 September 2002. As at 31 March 2005, ECMLP had an authorised share capital of RM1,000,000 comprising 1,000,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each, of which 500,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each are issued and fully paid-up. ECMLP is licensed by the Ministry of Housing and Local Government for the provision of credit services.

2.11 ECMLC

ECMLC was incorporated as a private limited company on 7 May 2002 under the Companies Act, 1965 under the name of ECM Capital Sdn. Bhd. It changed its name to the present name on 31 March 2004. As at 31 March 2005, ECMLC had an authorised share capital of RM5,000,000 comprising 5,000,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each, of which 1,000,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each are issued and fully paid-up. ECMLC is principally engaged in providing management, investment advisory and investment consulting services.

2.12 ECMLCM

ECMLCM was incorporated as a private limited company on 17 January 1994 under the Companies Act, 1965 under the name of MAC Ventures (Malaysia) Sdn. Bhd and then changed its name to Libra Capital Markets Sendirian Berhad on 12 December 1994. It changed its name to the present name on 21 October 2004. As at 31 March 2005, ECMLCM had an authorised share capital of RM5,000,000 comprising 5,000,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each, of which 2,000,000 ordinary shares of RM1.00 each are issued and fully paidup. ECMLCM is principally engaged as a fund manager and holds a fund manager's licence issued by the SC.

4. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies adopted by the Acquiree Companies are summarised as follows:

(a) Basis of Accounting

Other than ECM SecLtd, the financial statements of the Acquiree Companies are prepared under the historical cost convention and comply with applicable MASB Approved Accounting Standards in Malaysia and provisions of the Companies Act, 1965.

The financial statements of ECM SecLtd have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles in Hong Kong and with accounting standards issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants.

(b) Revenue Recognition

- Gross brokerage is recognised upon the execution of trade on behalf of clients, computed based on a pre-determined percentage of the contract value.
- Margin income comprise margin interest income and rollover fees. Margin interest income is recognised on an accrual basis except where such margin account is considered non-performing in accordance with Schedule 7A of the Rules of Bursa Securities, in which case recognition of such interest in suspended. Subsequent to suspension, interest is recognised upon receipt until all arrears have been paid. Rollover fees are recognised on an accrual basis. Rollover fees from non-performing margin accounts will be suspended until the accounts are reclassified as performing.
- Gains or losses on disposal of investments are recognised upon confirmation of transactions by the stockbrokers.
- Advisory, arrangement and placement fees are recognised as and when services are performed.
- Interest income is recognised on an accrual basis unless collectibility is in doubt, in which case they are recognised on receipt basis.
- Dividend income is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

(c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. The policy for the recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with accounting policy 4(i) below.



Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis to write off the cost of each asset to its residual value over the estimated useful life at the following annual rates:

Renovation, furniture and fittings	10% - 20%
Office equipment	15%
Computers	25%
Motor vehicles	20%

Upon the disposal of property, plant and equipment, the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the net carrying amount is recognised in the income statement.

(d) Foreign Currency Conversion

(i) Foreign Currency Transactions

Transactions in foreign currencies are initially recorded in Ringgit Malaysia at rates of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. At each balance sheet date, foreign currency monetary items are translated into Ringgit Malaysia at exchange rates ruling at that date, unless hedged by forward foreign exchange contracts, in which case the rates specified in such forward contracts are used. Non-monetary items initially denominated in foreign currencies, which are carried at historical cost, are translated using the historical rate as of the date of acquisition and non-monetary items which are carried at fair value are translated using the exchange rate that existed when the values were determined.

All exchange rate differences are taken to the income statement with the exception of differences on foreign currency borrowings that provide a hedge against a net investment in a foreign entity. These exchange differences are taken directly to equity until the disposal of the net investment, at which time they are recognised in the income statement.

(ii) Foreign Entities

Financial statements of foreign consolidated subsidiaries are translated at year-end exchange rates with respect to the assets and liabilities, and at exchange rates at the dates of the transactions with respect to the income statement. All resulting translation differences are recognised in equity.

Goodwill and fair value adjustments arising on the acquisition of a foreign entity are treated as assets and liabilities of the investor and translated at the exchange rate ruling at the date of the transaction.

(e) Employee Benefits

(i) Short Term Benefits

Wages, salaries, bonuses and social security contributions are recognised as an expense in the year in which the associated services are rendered by employees of the respective companies. Short term accumulating compensated absences such as paid annual leave are recognised when services are rendered by employees that increase their entitlement to future compensated absences. Short term non-accumulating compensated absences such as sick leave are recognised when the absences occur.



Each company makes statutory contributions to statutory approved provident funds, and contributions are charged to the income statements when incurred. Once the contributions have been paid, the companies have no further payment obligations. The post employment benefit scheme is in accordance with local practices in which it operates and is a defined contribution plan.

(ii) Retirement Benefits

In addition to statutory contributions to statutory approved provident funds as mentioned above, ECMLS also operates an unfunded defined contribution retirement benefits scheme for its employees. The benefits are determined based on the length of service at predetermined contribution rates.

The liability in respect of the scheme is based on the amounts identified for eligible employees and on the subsidiary company's contribution obligations in relation to the past earnings of such employees.

The initial provision was established in the financial year ended 31 December 2000 when the benefits of eligible employees first vested. Thereafter, the provision for each financial year is based on the accretion of ECMLS' contribution obligations computed on the appropriate proportion of the earnings of the eligible employees during the financial year. The provision in respect of individual employees is written back in the event of their cessation of employment prior to retirement.

(f) Income Tax

Deferred tax is provided for, using the liability method, on temporary differences at the balance sheet date between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. In principle, deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all taxable temporary differences and deferred tax assets are recognised for all deductible temporary differences, unused tax losses and unused tax credits to the extent that it is probable that taxable profit will be available against which the deductible temporary differences, unused tax losses and unused tax credits can be utilised. Deferred tax is not recognised if the temporary difference arises from goodwill or negative goodwill or from the initial recognition of an asset or liability in a transaction which is not a business combination and at the time of the transaction, affects neither accounting profit nor taxable profit.

Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period when the asset is realised or the liability is settled, based on tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is recognised in the income statement, except when it arises from a transaction which is recognised directly in equity, in which case the deferred tax is also recognised directly in equity, or when it arises from a business combination that is an acquisition, in which case the deferred tax is included in the resulting goodwill or negative goodwill.

(g) Investments in Subsidiary Companies, Associates and Other Non-Current Investments

Investments in subsidiary companies are stated at cost less impairment losses. The policy for the recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with policy 4(i) below. Impairment losses are charged to the income statement.



Investments in associates and other non-current investments are stated at cost less impairment losses. The policy for the recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with accounting policy 4(i) below. All impairment losses are charged to the income statement.

On disposal of such investments, the difference between net disposal proceeds and their carrying amounts is recognised in the income statement.

In relation to ECMLS and ECMLH, as permitted by paragraph 5(4)(a) of the Ninth Schedule of the Companies Act, 1965, the financial statements of the respective subsidiary companies of ECMLS and ECMLH have not been consolidated as ECMLS and ECMLH are both wholly owned subsidiaries of another body corporate incorporated in Malaysia.

(h) Goodwill

Goodwill represents the excess of the cost of acquisition over the investor's interest in the fair value of the identifiable assets and liabilities of a subsidiary company or associate at the date of acquisition. Goodwill is stated at cost less accumulated impairment losses. The policy for the recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with policy 4(i) below.

Goodwill arising on the acquisition of subsidiary company is presented separately in the balance sheet while goodwill arising on the acquisition of associates and jointly controlled entities is included within the respective carrying amounts of these investments. Negative goodwill represents the excess of the investor's interest in the fair value of the identifiable assets and liabilities of a subsidiary company of an associate at the date of acquisition over the cost of acquisition.

(i) Impairment of Assets

At each balance sheet date, each company reviews the carrying amounts of its assets to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, impairment is measured by comparing the carrying values of the assets with their recoverable amounts. Recoverable amount is the higher of net selling price and value in use, which is measured by reference to discounted future cash flows.

An impairment loss is recognised as an expense in the income statement immediately, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount. Any impairment loss of a revalued asset is treated as a revaluation decrease to the extent of any unutilised previously recognised revaluation surplus for the same asset.

(j) Provisions for Liabilities

Provisions for liabilities are recognised when the company has a present obligation as result of a past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation, and a reliable estimate of the amount can be made. Provisions are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate. Where the effect of the time value of money is material, the amount of a provision is the present value of the expenditure expected to be required to settle the obligation.



(k) Financial Instruments

Financial instruments are recognised in the balance sheet when the company has become a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Financial instruments are classified as liabilities or equity in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement. Interest, dividends, gains and losses relating to a financial instrument classified as a liability, are reported as expense or income. Distributions to holders of financial instruments classified as equity are charged directly to equity. Financial instruments are offset when the company has a legally enforceable right to offset and intends to settle either on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

(i) Marketable Securities

Marketable securities represent quoted shares which are carried at the lower of cost and market value, determine on a portfolio basis. Cost is determined on the weighted average basis while market value is determined based on quoted market values. Increases or decreases in the carrying amount of marketable securities are recognised in the income statement. On disposal of marketable securities, the difference between net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount is recognised in the income statement.

(ii) Receivables

In relation to ECMLS, trade receivables are carried at anticipated realisable values. Bad debts are written off when identified. Specific provisions for bad and doubtful receivables are made for accounts which have been classified as non-performing, net of interest-in-suspense and taking into consideration any collateral held, in accordance with the Rules of Bursa Securities. General provisions are made on a certain percentage of trade receivables (excluding outstanding purchase contracts which are not due for payment), net of interest-in-suspense and specific provision already made. When an account is classified as non-performing, interest is suspended and is subsequently recognised on a cash basis.

Clients' accounts are classified as non-performing under the specific circumstances as laid out and in accordance with the Rules of Bursa Securities.

Other receivables are carried at anticipated realisable values. Bad debts are written off when identified. An estimate is made for doubtful debts based on review of all outstanding amounts as at the balance sheet date.

(iii) Payables

Trade and other payables are stated at cost which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid in the future for goods and services received.

(iv) Interest Bearing Borrowings

Interest-bearing bank loans and overdrafts are recorded at the amount of proceeds received, net of transaction costs. All borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the income statement in the period in which they are incurred.



(v) Equity Instruments

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Dividends on ordinary shares are recognised in equity in the period in which they are declared.

The transaction costs of an equity transaction are accounted for as a deduction from equity, net of tax. Equity transaction costs comprise only those incremental external costs directly attributable to the equity transaction which would otherwise have been avoided.

(vi) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash and bank balances and short-term, highly liquid investments with maturities of three months or less from the date of acquisition and are readily convertible to cash with insignificant risk of changes in value, excluding monies held in trust.

5. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

Financial risk management of the Acquiree Companies are carried out on a group-wide basis which encompasses ECM Libra Berhad and its subsidiaries ("ECM Libra group"). As disclosed in the financial statements of ECM Libra for the financial year ended 31 March 2005, the operations of the ECM Libra group are subject to a variety of financial risks, including foreign currency risk, interest rate risk, liquidity risk and cash flows risk. The ECM Libra group has formulated a financial risk management framework whose principal objective is to minimise the ECM Libra group's exposure to risks and/or costs associated with the financing, investing and operating activities of the ECM Libra group.

Various risk management policies are made and approved by the Board of Directors of ECM Libra for observation in the day-to-day operations for the controlling and management of the risks associated with financial instruments and ECM Libra group's policy is not to engage in speculative transactions.

ECM Libra group's financial risk management policy seeks to ensure that adequate financial resources are available for the development of its businesses whilst managing its liquidity and credit risks. ECM Libra group operates within clearly defined guidelines that are approved by the Board of Directors of ECM Libra.

5.1 Operational Risk

The operational risk losses which would result from inadequate or failed internal processes, people and systems are managed through established operational risk management processes, proper monitoring and reporting of business activities by control and support units which are independent of the business units and oversight by the management and the Board of Directors of ECM Libra.

The operational risk management processes include comprehensive documentation of processes and procedures and built-in system of internal controls. Key back-up procedures, regular contingency planning, self-compliance audit and independent audits also form an integral part of the operational risk management process.



5.2 Equity Price Risk

Equity price risk refers to the risk of an adverse deviation of the mark-to-market value of a portfolio of securities in the time it takes for liquidation. It is the risk of loss that has to be absorbed by a company in the course of facilitation of client's trades or underwriting/placement activities.

Market risk arising from trading activities is independently marked-to-market on a daily basis against their predetermined market risk limits within internally approved policies and guidelines of Bursa Securities.

5.3 Foreign Currency Risk

Foreign currency exchange risk which arises from exchange rate movements may affect certain subsidiaries of the ECM Libra group's exposure to receivables and payables denominated in foreign currency. The ECM Libra group's exposure to foreign currency risk is minimal as its transactions are mainly denominated in Ringgit Malaysia (RM) and United States Dollar (USD). Up to financial year ended 31 March 2005, the imposition of currency controls via the pegging of RM to USD at the fixed exchange rate of USD1.00 to RM3.80 by Bank Negara Malaysia since September 1998 has stabilised the risk arising from foreign exchange fluctuations.

Hedging of foreign currency exchange risk through the use of forward exchange contracts may be adopted should the foreign exchange rate fluctuate widely.

5.4 Interest Rate Risk

Interest rate risk refers to volatility in net interest income as a result of changes in the levels of interest rate and shifts in the composition of the assets and liabilities. Interest rate risk is managed through interest rate sensitivity gap analysis. The potential reduction in net interest income from unfavourable interest rate movement is monitored closely and mark-to-market valuations are regularly reported to management.

The ECM Libra group is exposed to interest rate risk through the impact of rate changes on bank borrowings and interest bearing investments. It is the ECM Libra group's policy to place cash deposits on a short-term basis and therefore allows the ECM Libra group to respond to significant changes of interest rates promptly. This has minimised the ECM Libra group's interest rate exposure on interest bearing investments.

5.5 Credit Risk

Credit risk is the potential loss of revenue and principal losses in the form of specific provisions as a result of partial or total default of debts and/or margin financing.

Experienced key personnel are appointed to high level management committees to establish overall credit risk limits, margin financing assessment, collateral and prudent lending policies.

The ECM Libra group is exposed to credit risk mainly from trade receivables. The ECM Libra group extends credit to its customers upon careful evaluation of the customer's financial condition and credit history. The ECM Libra group also ensures a large number of customers so as to limit high credit concentration in a customer or customers from a particular market.



5.6 Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk relates to the ability to maintain sufficient liquid assets to meet its financial commitments and obligations when they fall due at a reasonable cost.

Liquidity risk is controlled through the Capital Adequacy Requirements of Bursa Securities and the ECM Libra group's liquidity risk management policy.

5.7 Cash Flow Risk

The ECM Libra group reviews its cash flow position regularly to manage its exposure to fluctuations in future cash flows associated with its monetary financial instruments.

As this report is only prepared in relation to the Acquiree Companies, no proforma group results and statement of assets and liabilities have been prepared. Instead, the historical financial information of each of the Acquiree Companies are presented as follows:

For the financial year/period under review, brokerage income was the main source of revenue followed by margin and interest income. For the financial period ended 31.3.05, share placement fee income also contributed significantly to revenue.
- (b) Other operating income comprises underwriting commission, dividend income, capital gain from the disposal of property, plant and equipment and shares as well as other sundry income. The significant increase in other operating income for the financial period ended 31.3.05 was due to the capital gain arising from the receipt of shares in Bursa Malaysia Berhad following the demutualization of the then Kuala Lumpur Stock Exchange.
- (c) Operating expenses mainly comprise remisiers and dealers' commission, staff costs, depreciation and provisions for doubtful debts and diminution in value of investments.
- (d) Finance costs are mainly related to interest expense on the bank credit facilities obtained, i.e overdrafts, Guarantee Revolving Underwriting Facility and Revolving Credit facilities, and utilised to finance the working capital requirement for the daily business trading. No interest expenses were incurred for the financial years/periods from 31.12.01 as ECMLS has no borrowings.
- (e) There was no tax charge for FYE 31.3.2001 as ECMLS was in a tax loss position. The effective tax rate for FPE 31.12.2001 and FYE 31.12.2002 was lower than the statutory tax rate mainly due to income not subject to tax and the utilisation of tax losses brought forward from prior years. There was no tax charge for FYE 31.12.2003 and FPE 31.3.2005 mainly due to income not subject to tax and the utilisation of tax losses brought forward from prior years.
